## 2. Best Search Engine

No, I am not on Altavista's payroll (but I would like to be)! This has long been my "first place to look". It is fast, comprehensive, complete (within the limits of the colossal web), and filled with elegant features:

### Translation Service

The link is right on the first page that opens on my Macintosh PowerPC/Netscape Communicator 4.5 browser after entering [www.altavista.com](http://www.altavista.com). It is in the list of "Useful Tools - Family Filter - Translation - Yellow Pages - People Finder - Maps - Usenet - Free Email". It allows you to translate short passages of French into English, Spanish or German and vice-versa. You can also translate any website into another language simply by entering the URL and the language you want to see. I have been advised by experts that it is an incredible service that will give much more meaning to language instruction and the Internet.

### Images Search

Just above the slot that carries your search term are four buttons on the main Altavista page: Web Pages - Images - Video - Audio. Each is equipped with a radio button. I use the Images button to

find great images; pictures of anything in a flash. Put in "Bicycles", click on images and I am given 626 images all in fine thumbnail detail. Click on the small sample and be taken to the website that holds the picture! The choice is incredible! You have to try the Video button. Just think what the Audio search will bring!

I realized that this Image search could lead to some problems for schools who contained some healthy young people. In the interests of scholarship, I checked a naughty word and discovered that the "Family Filter is on". I clicked on those words to discover that there was default position and I was in it. It was simple to remove the block, but it was just as easy to create a password for this station that would block others. The adult may control the searches! Wow! Altavista has incorporated a screen for the Internet without cost or fuss. There are too many other features to describe that you simply must explore. Let me lead you to, what may be the best part: [www.altavistacanada.com](http://www.altavistacanada.com)

It is not easy to find in Altavista - hidden in the International Connections but it offers an exceptional search engine limited (at least in its early hits) to Canadian sources. You must try it.

## The School Library Manifesto

The *School Library Manifesto*, modelled on the very successful *Public Library Manifesto* (a 1994 UNESCO document), was approved by UNESCO at the December 1998 meeting of the Programme General de l'Information in Paris, France.

The educational and cultural sectors of UNESCO are also involved, as the manifesto affects the pedagogical and cultural (literacy, information literacy, promotion of reading) concerns of member states. The original document comes from the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA), as designed by the members of the School Library Section of IFLA and endorsed by the IFLA Professional Board.

The manifesto is a statement of principles on the importance and role of the school library in the development of a country. It establishes the school library as an essential force in the economic development of a country. In its preamble it states:

***"The school library provides information and ideas that are fundamental to functioning successfully in today's information and knowledge-based society. The school library equips students with life-long learning skills and develops the imagination, enabling them to live as responsible citizens."***

Each country can and should develop its own principles and recommendations regarding the existence of school libraries based on the manifesto. It should also bring together, at the national and international levels, professional associations in the fields of education and libraries, politicians, business people, and all other interested parties. □

## Summary of Document

### Mission Statement

District Resource Centre and their staffs provide students and educators with cost effective, equitable access to learning resources and services through evaluating, planning, managing and promoting these resources.

### Leadership & Liaison

District Resource Centre staff provide leadership and liaison through the development and promotion of learning resources for use across the district and at the school level.

### Acquisition & Distribution of Learning Resources

District Resource Centres have coordinated systems for the acquisition and distribution of learning resources that ensure cost effective and equitable access across the entire school district.

### Evaluation & Selection of Learning Resources

A learner focused educational philosophy and the accompanying emphasis on resource-based learning has made the evaluation and selection of appropriate learning resources a vital component of curriculum implementation. Learning resources to support the teaching and learning of curricula are best selected by educators at the Provincial, District and School level.

### Management of District Resource Centres

Management includes the ability to administer District Resource Centre programs, facilities, services, and staff in order that these may contribute to the stated educational goals of the District and the Ministry.

### Design & Production of Learning Resources

Media to be used within the instructional framework are determined by the requirements of learning outcomes, course content and instructional methodology. Non-print materials can be obtained from commercial sources or produced locally.

### Information Technology

District Resource Centres personnel have the ability to promote the use of technology and investigate new resources, technology and services involving information technology.

### District Resource Centre Facilities

The Resource Centre should be designed to encourage the effective circulation and use of educational resources throughout the school district.

### Mission Statement

District Resource Centres and their staffs provide students and educators with cost effective, equitable district-wide access to learning resources and services through evaluating, acquiring, managing and promoting these resources. □

## IFLA Statement

### **IFLA Statement on Libraries & Intellectual Freedom**

This statement was prepared by IFLA FA-IFE and approved by the Executive Board of IFLA, 25 March 1999, The Hague, Netherlands.

IFLA-IFE (*The International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions*) supports, defends and promotes intellectual freedom as defined in the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

IFLA declares that human beings have a fundamental right to access to expressions of knowledge, creative thought and intellectual activity, and to express their views publicly.

IFLA believes that the right to know and freedom of expression are two aspects of the same principle. The right to know is a requirement for freedom of thought and conscience; freedom of thought and freedom of expression are necessary conditions for freedom of access to information.

IFLA asserts that a commitment to intellectual freedom is a core responsibility for the library and information profession.

IFLA therefore calls upon libraries and library staff to adhere to the principles of intellectual freedom, uninhibited access to information and freedom of expression and to recognize the privacy of library user.

IFLA urges its members activity to promote the acceptance and realization of these principles. In doing so, IFLA affirms that:

- Libraries provide access to information, ideas and works of imagination. They serve as gateways to knowledge, thought and culture.
- Libraries provide essential support for lifelong learning, independent decision making and cultural development for both individuals and groups.

- Libraries contribute to the development and maintenance of intellectual freedom and help to safeguard basic democratic values and universal civil rights.
- Libraries have a responsibility both to guarantee and to facilitate access to expressions of knowledge and intellectual activity. To this end, libraries shall acquire, preserve and make available the widest variety of materials, reflecting the plurality and diversity of society.
- Libraries shall ensure that the selection and availability of library materials and services is governed by professional considerations and not by political, moral and religious views.
- Libraries shall acquire, organize and disseminate freely and oppose any form of censorship.
- Libraries shall make materials facilities and services equally accessible to all users. There shall be no discrimination due to race, creed, gender, age or for any other reason.
- Library users shall have the right to personal privacy and anonymity. Librarians and other library staff shall not disclose the identity of users or the materials they use to a third party.
- Libraries funded from public sources and to which the public have access shall uphold the principles of intellectual freedom.
- Librarians and other employees in such libraries have a duty to uphold those principles.
- Librarians and other professional libraries staff shall fulfil their responsibilities both to their employer and to their users. In cases of conflict between those responsibilities, the duty towards the user shall take precedence.
