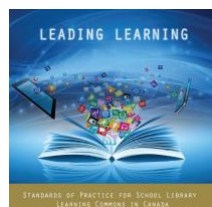




Resources from Canadian School Libraries

CSL Statement (May 2023): Book Challenges and Censorship in Canada's School Libraries:

CSL is deeply concerned about the growing number of calls to remove or restrict access to books in school library collections that express LGBTQia2s+ perspectives, represent characters of differing sexual orientations or gender identities, or deal with sexual health, and books where the main characters are people of colour. The statement explains these concerns and makes related recommendations to school districts.
